## District says address faked

### Man charged with lying to get son in Oldham school

A Louisville father is facing possible jail time and thousands of dollars in fines after police and school officials say he lied about his address for eight years so his son could attend Oldham County Schools.

Charles M. Lauron, 51, of New La Grange Road in Lyndon, was served with a criminal complaint Friday

and charged with theft by deception as part of a crackdown in Oldham that is expected to result in more parents charged in the coming weeks.

The case may be the first time a Kentucky school district has pursued criminal charges against a parent for allegedly enrolling a child in school illegally, though districts in other states, including Connecticut, Illinois and Ohio have charged parents for similar deceptions.

Lauron, who said he hasn't done

anything wrong, said he was told that Friday was his son's last day at North Oldham Middle. He said he's hiring a lawyer before he is due to be arraigned Sept. 26.

"I don't know what the big deal is," he said.

Oldham officials said they resorted to such measures because they've been battling the problem for years and wanted to send a strong message.

## Mice bring wrist relief

New mice from Smartfish can give your hand and wrist a break. Instead of moving your hand and arm up, back and sideways, your hand stays put while the Smartfish mouse pivots on its base.

Like other wireless mice, the Whirl ErgoMotion Mouse has left and right buttons with a scrolling wheel in between. A USB receiver snaps into a slot on its underside. Shaped like a thin bar of soap, the mouse has a smooth surface with slip-resistant side panels. All in all, it feels comfortable and secure in your hand.

But that whirling motion will take some time to get used to. Your instincts to push the mouse around the desk rather than mak-

ing it tilt on its axis. But if your present mouse is starting to bite back, this is an alternative worth investigating.

The mouse comes in a full-size and a mini format. Each costs about \$50 at [www.getsmartfish.com](http://www.getsmartfish.com).

combinations to add a digit to your message.

The Droid 3 also has more horsepower, with a 1-GHz dual-core processor and 16 GB of internal storage,

up from 8 GB. There's a new front-facing camera and an 8-megapixel camera and flash on the backside that records 1080p videos. And the screen has grown from 3.7 inches to 4 inches.

The trade-off for those new features is a phone that's slightly bigger and a little heavier than other keyboard phones, such as Sprint's EVO Shift 4G or the MyTouch 3G Slide at T-Mobile. But we're talking grams and millimeters, not ounces and inches.

Verizon sells the Droid 3 for \$199 with a two-year contract.
